On March 15, 2023, we hosted an event co-facilitated by our UN representative Anita Thomas, where nearly **70 people** joined Women First virtually to learn from our grantee partners about **community-led solutions to advance access to innovation**, **technology**, **and financial inclusion** for gender equality. The message from our partners was loud and clear, "**Nothing about us without us**."



In Conversation With...

Women of Influence (WOI)

Women of Influence (WOI), a partner organization in Dar Es Salaam, Tanzania, was formed by a group of lawyers who support women from disadvantaged backgrounds to cultivate business skills. Together, they work on closing the gender economic gap by breaking barriers, enhancing their impact, and bringing purpose to their work.

Who do you work with?

Our community is made up of small scale entrepreneurs, many of whom are women aged 18-50 with no knowledge on how to expand their businesses. This is due to lack of awareness on different aspects of business management, including the fear of formalizing their business which can potentially give them access to bigger markets, loans and tenders.

How do you drive change?

In collaboration with the local government, we help women who are small business owners to form groups and register themselves on the government portal, so as to be eligible for low or no interest loans, and register for government tenders. To date, we have been able to spread awareness on formalization of businesses and available opportunities after formalization to over 150-200 women at Kigogo, a district of Dar es Salaam. Of those, more than 50 have visited our offices for consultation and 10 women have successfully registered their business names.



What inspires you to continue this work?

Our belief is that if we guide women entrepreneurs to these opportunities they will increase their income. A majority of Women of Influence's team are entrepreneurs who have registered businesses, and are enjoying these opportunities themselves and hence, are passionate about replicating these strategies for women at the grassroots.


